

QUICK GUIDE:

Built Heritage Grants Scheme – Round 1 (2023-24)

Purpose

The Tasmanian Government has launched a Built Heritage Grants Scheme (the Grants Scheme) with the purpose of ensuring Tasmania's built heritage places are valued, protected and maintained, and leveraged for the benefit of Tasmania and Tasmanians.

A total of \$1 million is being made available under Round 1 (2023-24) of the Grants Scheme through two Programs:

- 1. Conservation Program** – small grants supporting state-registered property owners to undertake small but significant, heritage conservation and restoration activities.
- 2. Activation Program** – large grants supporting heritage property owners, skills development organisations and the community to activate heritage places.

Conservation Program

Eligible activities include conservation works, which for the purposes of this Program, includes preservation, repair, restoration and/or reconstruction of historically significant built fabric, that ensures the retention of the historic cultural heritage significance of the place.

This Program is open to properties permanently registered on the Tasmanian Heritage Register (THR).

This Program is **not** open to Local, State and Commonwealth governments (and their entities) and the National Trust of Australia (Tasmania).

Individual grants	\$5,000 to \$20,000
Applications open	15 January 2024
Applications close	15 April 2024

Activation Program

There are three Project Groups within this Program:

A: Building Activation: Supporting the activation of heritage properties for productive reuse, by co-funding the building conservation or restoration component of the works, with particular emphasis on building activation that helps grow the visitor demand for Tasmania.

This Project Group is open to properties permanently registered on the Tasmanian Heritage Register (THR) or heritage-listed in a Tasmanian Local Planning Scheme.

B: Community Activation: Supporting the activation of community support for built heritage, by co-funding events, community projects and interpretation initiatives.

This Project Group is open to Tasmanian-based organisations with an ABN.

C: Skills Activation: Supporting the activation of built heritage conservation skills development.

This Project Group is open to Tasmanian-based organisations with an ABN.

Activation Program *(continued)*

This Program is **not** open to State and Commonwealth governments (or their entities) and the National Trust of Australia (Tasmania). Local governments are **ineligible** to apply under Project Group A (Building Activation), but eligible to apply under Project Group B (Community Activation) and Project Group C (Skills Activation).

Co-investment conditions apply to this Program.

Individual grants	\$20,000 to \$200,000
Applications open	15 January 2024
Applications close	15 March 2024
